

TRANSPARENCY


Practicing organizational accountability by being open about information and decisions.

Vulnerable & marginalized populations

Vulnerable populations

Populations that are disproportionately affected by diseases, poverty, injustice and lack of development opportunities.

Marginalized populations

Populations that are socially stigma, less likely to benefit from health, social, educational and legal public policies and programs.

Among many populations that are in disadvantage for development, the following populations are identified by SCDI as both vulnerable and marginalized:

- Vulnerable and marginalized children and youth.
- Homeless people and slum dwellers.
- People who Use Drugs (PUD) and their families.
- Sex Workers (SW) and their children.
- People of sexual minorities and non-conforming gender identity (LGBTIQ+).
- People Living with HIV (PLHIV) and their families.
- People who experienced incarceration, including ex-prisoners and other people released detention and their families.
- Undocumented people.
- Ethnic minorities living in remote areas.
- Poor people including urban poor and landless rural people.

OUR OVERARCHING GOAL

SCDI's work will contribute to increase social inclusion and overall well-being of the marginalized and vulnerable populations and to protect the environment in Vietnam and beyond.



1 End AIDS, TB and Malaria in our focused provinces

1.1. For HIV, to achieve an incidence of 1 new infection per 1,000 persons/year among all key populations (KPs).

Follow-up Respondent Driven Sampling (RDS) to screen and evaluate the epidemiology among HIV KPs, to provide active care for PLHIV and active prevention for high-risk individuals.

Rate of annual new HIV cases detected by SCDI over total new cases in the province.

Provincial HIV treatment cascade among KPs.

Provincial HIV new infection rate.

1.2. For TB, to achieve an incidence of less than 20 cases per 100,000 population

“Two-engine plane” strategy to find and cure active and latent TB focusing on high-risk populations including close contacts using community-based outreach and care.

Rate of annual new TB cases detected by SCDI over total new cases in the province.

Rate of annual new latent TB cases detected by SCDI over the total new latent cases in the province.

Provincial TB and latent TB cascade.

Provincial TB new infection rate.

1.3. For malaria, to achieve elimination targets set by government for each province.

Rate of new malaria cases detected by SCDI over the total new cases in the province.

Rate of cases who completed the malaria treatment with SCDI's support over the total provincial number.

Provincial total malaria new infections.

2 To achieve Universal Health Coverage

2.1. To achieve at least 95% social health insurance (SHI) coverage among vulnerable and marginalized populations (VMPs).

Rate among VMPs in the province have SHI cards.

Rate among VMPs in the province can use SHI cards for healthcare services.

2.2. To have all major health needs of the vulnerable and marginalized populations covered by the national UHC schemes (SHI or others).

Results of SCDI advocacy efforts to enhance the access to healthcare services that are not covered by SHI.

Rate among people who use drugs can access harm reduction and/or addiction treatment services provided/supported by SCDI.

3 To achieve universal secondary school education

3.1. Proportion of vulnerable and marginalized children finish secondary school is equivalent to that in the general population of the province.

Rate among VMP children under 15 remained at school.

*KPs: Key Populations · VMPs: Vulnerable and Marginalized Populations

4 To eliminate extreme poverty

4.1. To eliminate extreme poverty among VMPs by 2027.

The total number of households living in extreme poverty in the province.

Rate of extreme poverty households among VMP households in the province.

Rate of households who escaped the extreme poverty due to SCDI's support.

4.2. To eliminate multidimensional poverty among VMPs by 2030.

The total number of poor households based on multidimensional poverty.

Rate of multidimensional poor households among VMPs in the province.

Rate of households who escaped the multidimensional poverty due to SCDI's support.

5 To protect human rights of everyone

5.1. All people of VMPs have a personal identification (PI) and recognized by the government.

Rate among VMPs have sufficient PI documents (PIDs)

Rate among VMPs have residency registration (RR).

Rate among VMPs obtain PIDs due to SCDI's support.

Rate among VMPs have RR due to SCDI's support.

5.2. VMPs can access legal and administrative services when they need.

Rate among VMP who cannot access public administrative and legal services.

Results of SCDI communications and advocacy efforts to improve the accessibility of VMPs to public administrative and legal services.

5.3. Policymakers, service providers, VMPs and the public have knowledge of sexual orientation, gender identity & expression, sexual characteristics (SOGIESC) and rights.

The improved awareness of policymakers, service providers, VMPs and the general public on SOGIESC and rights demonstrated by policies, public statements & media.

5.4. Mitigate the violence among/towards VMPs.

Victims of domestic violence, gender-based violence and child violence are provided with intervention to mitigate the adverse experiences and support the recovery.

6 To reduce practices harmful to the environment

6.1. To document and communicate impacts of environment and climate change on VMPs.

The awareness of VMPs on environmental issues.

6.2. To identify practices of the VMPs that harmful to the environment and start to change.

Information on environmental harmful practices carried out by VMPs.

Plans to change such harmful practices among VMPs.
